## TOWNSHIP OF CONOY LANCASTER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

## ORDINANCE NO. <u>/-3-/4</u>, 2013

## AN ORDINANCE DEFINING AND PROHIBITING NUISANCES IN THE TOWNSHIP OF CONOY, COUNTY OF LANCASTER AND COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF

WHEREAS, as the Board of Supervisors of Conoy Township, Lancaster County,

Pennsylvania deems it to be in the best interests and general welfare of the citizens and the

residents of this Township to prohibit the unreasonable, unwarrantable or unlawful use of private

or public property which causes injury, damage, or hurt to others in the legitimate enjoyment of
their rights of person or property; and

WHEREAS, Act 60 of 1995, (53 P.S. §66529) authorizes Townships of the Second Class to prohibit nuisances, to remove the same, and to impose Penalties therefor.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED**, and it is enacted and ordained by the Board of Supervisors of Conoy Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

Section 1. For the purpose of this ordinance the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meaning given herein. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words in the plural number include the singular number, and words in the singular number include the plural number, and the word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

1. "Abandoned or Junked Motor Vehicle" is any vehicle in non-serviceable condition or without having both a current inspection sticker and current registration plate.

- 2. "Board of Supervisors" is the Board of Supervisors of Conoy Township, Lancaster County.
- 3. "Nuisance" is the unreasonable, unwarrantable, or unlawful use of public or private property which causes injury, damage, hurt, inconvenience, annoyance or discomfort to any person or resident in the legitimate enjoyment of his reasonable rights of a person or property.
- 4. "Owner" is a person owning, leasing, occupying or having charge of any premises within the Township.
- 5. "Person" as used in this Ordinance shall include any individual, association, public or private corporation for profit or not for profit, partnership, firm, trust, estate, or any other legal entity whatsoever which is recognized by law as the subject of rights and duties. Whenever used in any clause prescribing and imposing a penalty or fine, the term "person" shall include the members of an association, partnership or firm and the officers of any public or private corporation for profit or not for profit.
- 6. "Township" is the Township of Conoy, which is located within the confines of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania.
- Section 2. No person shall continue, maintain, establish or carry on any of the following prohibited acts or activities on any public or private property in the Township of Conoy, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania (the "Township") if the same are determined to be and constitute nuisances in fact:
- (a) The storage, accumulation or depositing of any abandoned or junked vehicles or parts thereof;

- (b) The storage, accumulation, or depositing of any damaged motor vehicles or parts thereof, whether or not having a current inspection sticker and/or a current registration plate, which are leaking automotive fuels or automotive liquids;
- (c) The storage, accumulation or depositing of garbage, ashes, rubbish or other refuse matters, including unusable or abandoned building materials;
- (d) The maintenance of any dangerous structure including buildings or parts of buildings in a state of dilapidation or disrepair or abandoned or unoccupied buildings or parts thereof that represent a risk of harm to people;
- (e) Except in the Rural and Agricultural Zoning Districts, the permitting or allowing the growth of any vegetation not edible or planted for some useful or ornamental purpose, to exceed a height of ten (10) inches, to throw off any unpleasant or noxious odor, or to produce pollen; or
- (f) The operation of remote controlled or other non-tethered aircraft over property not owned by the operator and without the permission of the property owner.
- Section 3. The Zoning Officer of the Township, or his/her duly authorized assistants, shall be the official authorized to serve written notice, either personally or by certified or first class mail, on any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance to remove any nuisance or dangerous structure on public or private property. Upon the failure of said person to comply with such notice within fifteen (15) days after receipt thereof or to request a hearing within such time before the Board of Supervisors pursuant to the Act of December 2, 1968, P.L. 1133, known as the "Local Agency Law," the Board of Supervisors of the Township may remove or arrange for the removal of the nuisance or dangerous structure and collect the cost of such removal together

with a penalty of twenty-five percent (25%) of the cost of the removal from the person failing to comply with such notice by summary proceedings or in the manner provided for the collection of municipal claims or by a civil action without the filing of a claim. The Board of Supervisors may also institute proceedings in equity to enjoin violation of this Ordinance.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be enforced pursuant to 53 P.S. 66601(c.1) (2). Any person who or which shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof by summary proceeding before any Magisterial District Judge having jurisdiction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00). If a defendant sentenced to pay a fine or costs after finding of guilt in a summary case, defaults in such payments, the defendant may be sentenced and committed to the Lancaster County Prison for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days. Each day that a violation of this Ordinance continues and/or each violation of a provision of Section 2, shall constitute a separate offense. Such fine and costs shall be in addition to the remedies provided in Section 3 of this Ordinance and shall be enforceable and recoverable in the manner provided by applicable law. All fines collected for the violation of this ordinance shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Township for the general use of the Township.

Section 5. In the event any provision, section, sentence, clause or part of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect or impair any remaining provision, section, sentence, clause or part of this Ordinance, it being the intent of this Township that such remainder of this Ordinance shall be and shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 6. This ordinance shall not act as a repeal of any other Township ordinances except to the extent that this Ordinance addresses the same conduct or condition and is directly in contradiction to such other Ordinance.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force five (5) days after its enactment.
