PENNSYLVANIA'S SCHOOL BUS STOPPING LAW

Keeping Children Safe

PENNSYLVANIA'S SCHOOL BUS STOPPING LAW

- When you meet or overtake a stopped school bus with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended, you MUST STOP.
- When you approach an intersection where a school bus is stopped with red signal lights flashing and stop arm extended, you MUST STOP.
- You MUST STOP at least ten (10) feet away from the school bus.
- You MUST WAIT until the red lights have stopped flashing and the stop arm has been withdrawn before moving.
- ◆ DO NOT MOVE until all the children have reached a place of safety.

KNOW YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1.5 million children are transported on Pennsylvania roads each day.
- These children are transported approximately 400 million miles to school each year.
- ◆ To further promote safety, school vehicles may be equipped with a yellow flashing or revolving light.
- ♦ Every year, children are needlessly injured or killed by drivers passing stopped school buses.



You MUST STOP on roadways with or without painted lines.



You MUST STOP at an intersection, whether it is or is not marked with a stop sign. All traffic MUST stop.



You MUST STOP on roadways with ridged/grooved dividers.

MESA Fee Hearing

You are invited to attend a public hearing on MESA's annual estimated fees on September 28, 2023 from 7-9 pm at the Elizabethtown Brethren in Christ Church, 996 East High Street, Elizabethtown, PA.

The hearing is being held and will be conducted in accordance with the Pennsylvania Municipality Authorities Act.

MESA has prepared an estimated budget in conjunction with a local CPA firm to provide EMS services. The estimated operating budget is \$5,605,594.00 for 2024. The method of assessment of estimated fees was calculated using Northwest EMS call volume by occupancy classification; county parcel and tax data, and individual municipal data.

The estimated annual fee per residential unit is proposed to be \$85.00 per year.
Commercial/Businesses are based off the Full Time Equivalent Employee.

Street Snow Removal - Winter is just around the corner and as it approaches our Public Works Dept. will be busy preparing our equipment for the first winter event. As in past years, River Rd, Turnpike Rd, Bainbridge Rd, Second St, & Race St will be plowed first since they are the main roads in Conoy Twp. Once these roads are plowed, the other areas of Conoy are started. Our plow drivers are instructed and mandated to plow as close to the curb or street edge

as possible. If your sidewalk or driveway was shoveled before the snow plow came through, more snow may end up back on the area. DO NOT SHOVEL THE SNOW BACK INTO THE STREET. In the event of snowfall over 4", please find alternate parking if you live on Second or Race Streets so the township can plow curb to curb. This is essential as these are the two main emergency routes in Bainbridge. Winter Driving Advice - Clear your windows of snow and ice so you can see clearly. Clear snow from the roof. Always use your headlights in poor winter weather conditions. Choose the right winter tires. Allow extra time during winter travels. Check your fuel and fluid levels. Replace worn or damaged wiper blades. Apply breaks gently. Leave plenty of room between vehicles when driving especially up and down hills.

Youth Programming: Musik Time takes place throughout the year on the third Tuesday of the month.


