Property Tax Rent Rebate Program

The Pennsylvania Property Tax/Rent Rebate program is open to state residents 65 or older, widows and widowers 50 or older, or anyone age 18 and over who is 100% disabled.

New income limits for 2024 are \$45,000 a year for both homeowners and renters. Note: Only half of your Social Security income is included in calculations.

TRASH & VOUCHER INFORMATION

Conoy Township residents have the option to select their own trash/recycling hauler. This allows our residents to negotiate with haulers to obtain the best price based off their individual need. Did you know, Lancaster County only recycles the Big 4? If you recycle as part of your trash service please follow the guidelines established by LCSWMA. If you currently do not recycle, we ask you to help protect our planets resources and start a recycling program today. LCSWMA offers a free recycling drop off container at their River Road location.

2024 Vouchers - The 2024 vouchers are available for residents to pick up. Please stop by the township office during regular business hours.

Sewer Payments - Sewer bills are mailed quarterly: January 15, April 15, July 15, & October 15. Sewer payments can be made online with a credit card or your banking account information. Go to https://conoytownship.org/sanitary-sewer for more information. Any account over four quarters past due will be sent to the solicitor for collections and/or the filing of a municipal lien against the property. All fees associated with collections will be the property owners responsibility and will be posted on the account. Currently 58 properties make up \$64,347.00 past due. This has a negative effect on all users of the sewer system.



Brush Pile - Township residents may utilize the brush pile located off River Road. Branches no larger than 6" in diameter and no longer than 8' are

accepted as well as leaves and Christmas trees. Dirt, sod, landscape pavers, branches greater than 6" diameter, and rocks are not accepted. The brush pile is for Conoy Township residential properties only. It is not for commercial establishments including commercial establishments owned by Conoy Township Residents.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE REMINDERS

- The storage, accumulation or depositing of any abandoned or junked vehicles or parts thereof is prohibited. Abandoned or Junked Motor Vehicle is described as any vehicle in non-serviceable condition or without having both a current inspection sticker and current registration plate.
- The storage, accumulation, or depositing of any damaged motor vehicles or parts thereof, whether or not having a current inspection sticker and/or a current registration plate, which are leaking automotive fuels or liquids is prohibited.
- The storage, accumulation or depositing of garbage, ashes, rubbish or other refuse matters, including unusable or abandoned building materials is prohibited.
- The maintenance of any dangerous structure including buildings or parts of buildings in a state of dilapidation or disrepair or abandoned or unoccupied buildings or parts thereof that represent a risk of harm to people is prohibited.
- Except in the Rural and Agricultural Zoning
 Districts, the permitting or allowing the growth of



any vegetation not edible or planted for some useful or ornamental purpose, to exceed a height of ten-inches is **prohibited**.

These are some of the problems that arise as the weather gets warmer. By staying on top of these issues you can avoid letters from the Township (which could result in fines). As a reminder, LCSWMA provides a disposal program for Conoy Township residents which offers a limited number of free disposal trips to its Lancaster WTE facility located on River Road each year with proper voucher cards. There are also several area junk/junk car removal services available to assist you.

CLEAR SIGHT TRIANGLE

A clear sight triangle is defined as a triangular shaped portion of land (see graphic) which is established at the intersection of streets in which nothing is erected, placed, planted or allowed to grow, which limits or obstructs the view of motorists entering or leaving the intersection. Please ensure that all bushes and trees are kept trimmed within all clear sight triangles so as not to cause a visibility problem for traffic.

Fences and Walls


A permit is required to be obtained prior to the installation of a fence or freestanding wall. *Livestock fencing is exempt from this requirement*. Here are a few of the requirements for fences and freestanding walls:

- No fence or freestanding wall shall be erected to a height of more than forty-two inches in any front yard, with a few exceptions.
- No Fence or wall shall be erected to a height of more than six feet in any side or rear yard, with the exception of properties located in the Local Commercial District and Industrial District.
- Fences along side or rear lot lines are not subject to yard or setback requirements. Freestanding walls shall be setback five (5) feet from side and rear lot lines.
- Fences or freestanding walls within the front yard shall be located a minimum of two (2) feet behind the required street right-of-way. All fences shall be located completely within lot boundaries and no fence may coincide with any lot line. If you are unsure of where your property lines/boundaries are, it is highly advisable to obtain the services of a professional surveyor.
- No fence or freestanding wall shall be erected within any clear sight triangle, within any area which blocks or limits visibility for driveways on adjacent properties, or within a public right-of-way or other rights-ofways or easements.

Swimming Pools

Any pool with the ability to hold water deeper than twenty-four (24) inches requires a permit and inspection from Conoy Township. This includes "big box store" pool kits (Blue Wave, Intex, etc.). Consider the following building permit guidelines BEFORE you make a pool purchase:

- Swimming pools must be completely enclosed by a four (4) foot high fence or wall with a self-closing locking gate. This does not apply to above ground pools having a minimum solid wall height of four feet and having a retractable ladder, or those having less than twenty-four (24) inches of water. The fence or wall must be erected and inspected before the pool is filled with water.
- All pools shall be set back ten (10) feet from side and rear property lines measured either from the wall of the pool or any associated decking or concrete aprons.
- No water from a pool shall be discharged onto any public street or alley nor onto any adjoining property.
- Pools MAY NOT use extension cords to connect the pump. A single twist -lock receptable may be located between five and ten feet from the pool. A 120-volt convenience outlet shall be located within ten feet and twenty feet of the pool. All receptacles serving the pool and all outdoor receptables shall be GFCI protected.

2024 County/Municipal Tax Bills

During the 2024 budget process last year, the Board of Supervisors approved a 0.5 mill Real Estate tax for Conoy Township. Residents will now notice this on their County/Municipal Real Estate Tax bill. The real estate tax is expected to generate \$119,556.00 to help balance the General Fund Budget. The Board of Supervisors also sold the rental property located at 215 Falmouth Road in January 2024. The sale proceeds will also be used to help balance the 2024 budget. With the real estate tax and the sale of the rental property, the General Fund Budget is still projected to have a deficient of approximately \$87,978.00. Municipal Emergency Services Authority of Lancaster County (MESA) is now providing 911 EMS Ambulance Service. Unlike ambulance agencies that generate revenue through voluntary contributions, which leave them deeply underfunded, MESA charges property owners and employers a mandatory annual fee to fund its operations and ensure 24/7 readiness to respond to EMS calls. Annual bills for 2024 were mailed in mid-February. Payment is due by March 15, 2024.
